Changes to volunteer requirements for year end Awards

OVCTA has required that in order to receive a year end award, Recipients MUST volunteer in some capacity for the OVCTA (shows or clinics) during the calendar year of achievement. Volunteer hours of a spouse or other family member can fulfill volunteer requirement for the member.

The OVCTA board has been aware of the difficulty for some members to get their volunteer requirements fulfilled in the traditional manor so they addressed this issue at the December board meeting and have come up with some additional options.

Volunteer hours for end of the year points - The board decided that volunteer hours cannot be transferred to friends, however we are going to offer other ways for volunteers to meet their requirements. The following suggestions are: usual traditional volunteer hours (1/2 day =4hrs) at an OVCTA Event; donating 2 or more items to the silent auction at the annual meeting; if you are an instructor, bringing 2 or more students to show at an OVCTA horse show; provide 2 or more sponsors for BSS for a total of \$50; organize an OVCTA event such as an educational talk, clinic, horse show, fund raiser; or write an article for the newsletter. It was also decided that at each board meeting, we will announce two things that people can volunteer to do. This will be announced in our Constant Contact emailings.

ENTERING RECOGNIZED SHOWS By Alice Morse

Congratulations, you are ready to move up to recognized dressage shows! If you have been showing unrecognized, you should already have some of this in place. Your horse will need a Coggins Test, documentation of flu and rhino vaccinations, and possibly a health certificate if you are shipping across state lines or the show location requires it. These papers must have your horse's full show name on them and must be current for all days the horse will be on the show grounds. You may need to bring hard copies of some of this with you to the show. (I have a notebook in my tow vehicle with copies of all health papers and membership cards.)

You will need membership numbers for USEF and USDF for the horse, rider, owner, trainer, and possibly coach. For USEF members 18 and older you will also need to have completed all modules of Safe Sport (google Safesport USEF) which expires one years after completion and will likely have a renew date different from any other documentation.

If you are entering the show using an on-line service and can upload the documentation before opening date, do so. Then check to be sure everything is showing up as correct. If you are going to mail the entry in, make copies of all necessary paperwork.

As long as you are going to all this trouble you should also be sure you and your horse are eligible for any awards such as USDF All-Breeds, National Dressage Pony Cup Pony or Small Horse, TIP for thoroughbreds, awards provided by your horse's breed organization, and local organization awards. These all have different criteria and different show years. Be sure you have read the requirements carefully and have registered the horse, owner, rider(s) as needed. For some awards all paperwork must be complete before the show for it to count, for others you have until a certain date to register and make all the year's shows count retroactively. Once you are in the program, some calculate the award automatically, others require you to send in on-going reports or a single report at the end of their show year. For local organizations you probably need to complete volunteer hours.

I set up my show schedule at the beginning of the year and make a list of all opening and closing dates as well as dates Coggins, flu/rhino, or Safe Sport need to be renewed. I also include dates that year-end award information is due by. This lives on my computer desktop so I remember to enter shows on opening date.

I also keep an Excel spreadsheet for each of my horses for each show year. Each dressage test has a row and each award has a column. At the bottom of the column is a formula that calculates the points or score for that award. Below that box is one with the requirements for the award and another noting either that the requirements are fulfilled or which ones are still needed. This is a necessity for me as last year my New Forest Pony was eligible for New Forest awards with four riders, National Dressage Pony Cup Small Horse with three riders, USDF All-Breeds and OVCTA with two riders, and DVCTA with one rider. And I had two other horses also competing. We do this for fun, but some extra work may get you some nice rewards.

Board Notes April 9th, 2019

The board met at the home of Kim Leppold on April 9th, 2019

The board welcomes new member Lin Braddick, a local horseback riding instructor, long-time OVCTA member, dressage and trail rider

Election of new Officers—Nancy Peltier was elected as President, Debby Hadden was elected as Vice President, Criss Brown was elected as Treasurer, and Jan Brooks was elected as Secretary.

Membership— currently there are only 46 members who have renewed their membership or joined as new members. Members who have not renewed their memberships will be contacted individually by board members as a reminder.

Finances-The club's bank balance is \$12141.97 The treasurer reported that \$939 income was made from the silent auction at the annual meeting.

Endowment Fund—the quarterly statement for the 1st quarter of 2019 has not yet been received.

Fund raising/Promotions—The spring show has ordered coffee mugs as a thank you gift for the volunteers and will have some extra inventory available to use as gifts and for sale. The show committee is ordering a new color show tee shirt which will be available for purchase at the show and beyond. Members will be able to use volunteer chits towards the purchase price of the tee shirt. The final price has not yet been determined.

Activities— the Annual meeting was held on March 29th. The guest speaker, Dr. Samantha Fraysier made a very informative presentation on Equine Gastric Ulcer Syndrome. Annemarie Cochran was presented the Volunteer of the Year award for all her ideas and help with our educational seminars. The year end awards were presented and our silent auction was held. It was suggested that we try to contact Michael Matz for next year's speaker.

It was agreed that our educational seminars are very popular and Criss B suggested contacting Richard Malmgren about speaking on "preparing a horse for sale". Another topic mentioned was Lyme Disease. Kim L will research who might be a good speaker for that. Deb M updated the board on the Spring Show on May 26th. Nancy P is organizing 2 casual schooling shows in conjunction with Hunter Hill Stables: a Summer Fun horse show on June 22nd and Dressage at the Beach on July 6th. Deb M will contact Equine Exchange about possible August dates for our annual Tack Swap. An Ovcta member has offered their facility as a show venue. It was decided that after the spring show several board members would visit the facility.

Next Meeting— the next meeting will be May 14th at the home of Courtney Nathan-Materdomini. All members are welcome to attend but please contact Nancy Peltier if you attending. nancy.peltier@comcast.net

A Synopsis of OVCTA Lauren Annett Winter Dressage Clinics

Every winter Alice Morse organizes a series of Dressage Clinics with Lauren Annett (this year's judge of our Spring Show) This summary shows what a valuable asset these clinics are and how lucky we are to have Lauren available...

For a change, Mother Nature gave us some nice weather for the November Clinic. Horses and riders included quite a few of the usual with a couple of new added.

Take-aways from this clinic: Ride the horse you are sitting on right now; not the one from two minutes or two months ago. Do what works. Have confidence in yourself

that if what you are doing is working for that horse at that time, then it's correct. Give your horse a job. If your horse is being distracted by something in the arena or the

deer grazing outside, make your circle slightly smaller, flex him to the inside, leg-yield out, and send him forward.

In January Mother Nature did not smile upon us. At 6:30 AM we made the decision to cancel as the roads were far from trailer-friendly.

When, in February, Lauren asked us how our horses were going we responded as typical type A dressage riders - he still drops his shoulder, needs to carry more,

does not hold the canter. Although that may be true, Lauren reminded us how far we have all come in two months in spite of some very challenging weather. While the

light bulb moments are rewarding and addictive, we need to accept that the training process will also give us times when it feels different and maybe a little scary.

March 10th was the last of the Winter series. As always it was a fun learning experience. Several horses and riders used this clinic to build confidence. Two young horses

started out with Lauren riding and ended with their AA riders on board. Other riders were working on building a confident partnership with their horses. Lauren admonished

me to channel my inner cross country girl while cantering my New Forest Pony. In the end I was grinning, the auditors were cheering, and my pony was saying "whatever;

if that was so great, do I get a treat?".

Theses clinics have provided wonderful educational opportunites for horses, riders, and auditors in a very positive environment. Thank you to Lauren for once again sharing her expertise; to Denise, Doreen, and Carl for the use of the lovely facilities; to Nicole and Kristi for their help; and to OVCTA for providing these opportunities.

Free Money! OVCTA Scholarships!

Every year the club budgets \$1200 to use for OVCTA scholarships. They can be used for many educational opportunities: lessons, clinics, seminars, attendance to USDF, USEA meetings, instructors forums, etc. The scholarship does not need to be used for an OVCTA functions. The requirements are not difficult to meet and it's easy to apply for one. Don't forget to consider using a scholarship to enhance your education. The amount of each scholarship awarded will be 50% of the entry fee to the event, but no less than \$50 and not to exceed \$150.

OVCTA SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Must be an OVCTA member in good standing for a period of at least 1 year or 12 months.
- Must not have received a scholarship in the last 12 months.

APPLICATIONS SHOULD INCLUDE:

- List of OVCTA events the applicant has participated in (i.e committees, schooling shows, clinics, annual meeting, etc.) and how they contributed (i.e. as a volunteer, a rider, an organizer, a committee member, etc.). Volunteer participation may be used as a deciding factor.
- 2. A brief description of the applicant's riding background, level they are presently at and short term goals.
- 3. The Event Data: Name & Date of the Event. Rider or Auditor. Potential benefits of attending this event and how it will help the applicant reach their goals.

1. Write an article about your experience & submit it to the newsletter.

SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE:


